
(7/31/22 Match report prepared by Jeff Swartz)
After a long 6-week interval since our last Airgun Field Target Match, Fairfield Sportsmen's Association held their $3^{\text {rd }}$ FT event of 2022 on Sunday July $31^{\text {th }}$, 2022. After a beautiful and mild temperature Saturday setting up, we anticipated having nice weather on Sunday too. Instead we awoke to a rain storm. Mercifully, it slid by us and cleared up around 10 AM. We then rushed to set up the sight-in range and get things started. Amazingly enough, after the rain stopped the sun came out and even became a factor on the 3-4 lanes that don't have shaded shooting positions. But, overall the low 80 's temps were appreciated.

Wind was noticed a bit on the sight-in range, but in the now densely filled in woods (or more appropriately "Jungle"), it was barely existent. The Troyer rating of the course, which was originally laid out to be right around a challenging 33T, somehow morphed into a 33.7 T monster in our efforts to make sure there were 10 lanes over 40 yards. The forced position lanes saw difficulty ranging from 28T up to 42 T , even with one $1-3 / 8$ and three $1-1 / 2$ kill zones. And as expected, the forced position lanes saw the lowest hit percentages. To add to the difficulty, some dark targets set in very darkly shaded areas became brutal after all the paint on the paddles was knocked off, and would likely drive the overall Troyer rating well over 34 .

9 shooters, 7 in Hunter PCP and 2 in Hunter Piston, had the faith to show up in the rain and were rewarded with a fantastic day of shooting. The participants shrugged off the high course difficulty and shot some very nice scores, with most in the 40's or above. In the Hunter PCP class Jeff Swartz and Justin Roberts tied for $1^{\text {st }}$ with a score of 53 . Justin was crowned the champion after a coin toss. There was also a tie for $3^{\text {rd }}$ at 47 between Dale Prulheire and relative newcomer Ron Francis with Dale winning the coin toss. Nolan Caudill turned in the top score of 27 in the Hunter Piston class. We were excited to see a new shooter from the Cincinnati area show up. Steve Wells joined us and shot the match with a 20 year old Gamo springer and very little if any preparation. After some on-course discussions and education, I'm sure he will be much better prepared next time and we anticipate his score will double or possibly triple.
