

(9/24/23 Match report prepared by Jeff Swartz)

FSA's second to last field target match of 2023 was held on Sunday, September 24. It was great to see 5 relatively new shooters participate. There were 3 that have shot a couple matches, but not yet a full season. And there were 2 who were shooting their very first FT match. We paired the new guys with some of our more experienced

shooters so they could be shown how an FT match works, ask questions, and pick up some tips. They all came well prepared, all shot well (especially for their first match), and I think they all enjoyed the match. We hope to see all of them return for our last match of the year.

When we set up the course on paper, we had a Troyer rating of 33.27. We tried to get creative and made at least a dozen or more changes to target placements and yardages, with some moving closer and some farther. After the set-up was complete, the course ended up being a 33.29 Troyer. There were 12 targets over 40 yards and the average distance was 36 yards. I didn't punch all of the info into the spreadsheet before the match, and I later discovered we had an illegal target (for a Grand Prix, which this was not). The beaver has a 1-3/8 KZ and was placed at 48 yards (3 yards beyond the max allowed). The target was under a 40T, so it was still rather fair.

It was a beautiful day to spend in the woods. The temperature was a little cool at 9:00 AM, but it quickly climbed, and many shed a jacket or an extra layer. I'm not sure of the exact temp, but if it ever topped 70, it wasn't by much. The skies were clear and blue and we had some winds that came and went, but gradually increased throughout the day.

We had 2 shooters in the WFTF PCP class, with Tyler Partner coming out on top with a phenomenal 59. Sadly, Tyler missed the closest target on the course, a cardinal with a 3/8" KZ at 16 yards, otherwise he would have tacked on a second cleaned course for the year. Eric Jones was our only hunter piston shooter, and this match marked the return of his Diana 54. Eric shot a 42. In our most contested class of Hunter PCP, we had 10 shooters, with Ryan Spanagel coming out on top with a 54, besting Jeff Swartz who shot a 52 for second place. We had a tie for third place, with Ken Santo and Ana Rose Spanagel both shooting a 48. I

believe 48 is Ken's personal best and it was great to see him getting his Theoben Rapid dialed in. The shooters opted for a coin flip to break the tie. No one had a coin, so we flipped a pocket knife. The side with wording on it was heads and that was Ana Rose's call which put her in third place.
